- Human rights are based on the principle of respect for the individual.
- Their basic premise is that every person is a moral and rational being who deserves to be treated with dignity.
- They are called human rights because they are universal.



HISTORY OF HUMAN RIGHTS

• in 1948 for the first time in history the rights and freedoms that every human deserves was written in an official document, the "Universal Declaration of Human Rights", by the United Nations General assembly.


A MORAL REVOLUTION

CHINA

 - there is death penalty
 - one child policy (people can't make their own decisions)
 - China still is under a **dictatorship** (only some news can be spread)
 - lack of religious freedom (repression of the Christians)
 - discrimination against rural workers and ethnic minorities.


WHEN HUMAN RIGHTS ARE VIOLATED
